9a. Displays (of photos/posters/art) and books reflect people of different professions, cultures, ages, genders, and abilities.

9b. Books are available in languages spoken at home by children; books depict both men and women engaged in gender-neutral work activities (e.g., female firefighter, male sewing).

9c. Music, decorations, and activities in the classroom reflect the variety of languages and cultures of the families in the program.

### **Description:**


Families in the program are encouraged to share food, decorations and activities around the special holidays of their cultures.
