


## Using the BDI-2 Data Manager with the Screening Test

For purposes of reporting data to Florida Child Outcomes Measurement System, the BDI-2 Screening Test is allowed as a preliminary assessment to determine the need for administering the BDI-2 Complete Assessment. When using the BDI-2 Screening Test as part of Child Outcomes Measures the following guidelines are emphasized:

- Assessments should be conducted in the domains of Adaptive, Personal-Social, and Communication.
  - Note: In some instances the use of all five domains is required (some districts require all domains for progress monitoring and/or for evaluations for eligibility for ESE services). However, for purposes of Child Outcomes, three domains are required.
- When determining the “Cut Score” for scoring “Pass” or “Refer” a standard deviation of **-1.5** is used. When the scores for the screening test are entered into the BDI-2 Data Manager, a chart is provided to show pass or refer based on standard deviation (see below).

### Entering Scores from a Screening Test:

- Search for the child’s existing record in the Data Manager and select the “Test” button.
- Select “New Screener” from the next screen




- Complete the information for the Date and Examiner of the BDI-2 Screening Test in the same way as for the full assessment. (See directions in Tool Kit)
- Enter the scores from the BDI-2 Screening Test in the same way as for the full assessment.
- Verify results as “Pass” or “Refer” by clicking on “Domain Totals”

If a domain area is scored as “Refer” on the Screening Test, the Complete Assessment should be administered in that domain. “Refer” Scores that are not followed up by the full domain assessment will not be counted for Child Outcomes.

- Domains (Adaptive, Personal-Social, and Communication) which are scored in the “Refer” range should be followed up with the complete assessment for Florida Child Outcomes Measurement System.
  - When entering data for a follow-up full assessment, it is necessary to select “New Complete Assessment” from the menu even though all domains might not be administered.
- Enter the Program Note:
  - The data point for the full assessment should match the data point entered for the Screening Test (example: Part B Entry, Part B Exit, 0, or 1).
  - Follow the directions for Program Note on the document for Entering Scores and Program Notes in the Tool Kit.
