


Math Activities for Counting

Hands-on Activity for Children

Let your child help with cutting or have an adult do the cutting. Let your child paint or color the frogs and log. Use a paper bag, cardboard box, or real sticks or log for the log. **Remember, staying in line is not the important thing – Enjoying the activity is more important than coloring in the lines.** You can use the simple frog pattern above or just a green circle with two eyes will give your child the idea of a frog.



Put the frogs on the log. Use small circles of paper or beans for bugs. (Supervise for safety).
Write the numbers 1, 2, 3, 4 5.
Have fun acting out the story. Sing along.

Expand the activity: Have your child hop like a frog. Put down a blue fabric or towel and have your child hop in the pond and out of the pond. Put down a brown towel or fabric and have your child hop on and off the log.
