

## **Connecting Progress Monitoring to the Child Outcomes Summary (COS) Process**

The COS process requires a complete picture of the child's skills and behaviors from multiple sources and across multiple settings and situations.

It is especially important to get a picture of the child in places where they spend time, including at home, in childcare, and in other community settings.



## **Guidelines for Progress Monitoring:**

- Several different methods are used to **observe** and **record** information.
- Information is collected from different activities and environments.
- Information is collected from different sources.
- Procedures for collecting information are planned and clear to the teaching team.
- Instruction is modified if the learning goal is too easy or too difficult.
- Instruction and support are designed and differentiated for all students in all settings.
- Data is analyzed frequently to compare expected and actual progress.
- Data is used to inform instruction.
