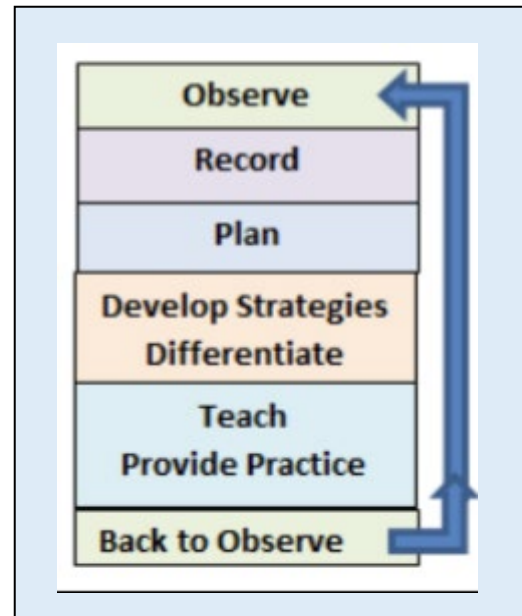


## Connecting Progress Monitoring to the Child Outcomes Summary (COS) Process

The COS process requires a complete picture of the child's skills and behaviors from multiple sources and across multiple settings and situations.

It is especially important to get a picture of the child in places where they spend time, including at home, in childcare, and in other community settings.



### Guidelines for Progress Monitoring:

- Several different methods are used to **observe** and **record** information.
- Information is collected from **different activities and environments**.
- Information is collected from **different sources**.
- Procedures for collecting information are **planned** and clear to the teaching team.
- **Instruction is modified** if the learning goal is too easy or too difficult.
- Instruction and support are designed and **differentiated for all students in all settings**.
- Data is **analyzed frequently** to compare expected and actual progress.
- Data is used to inform instruction.
